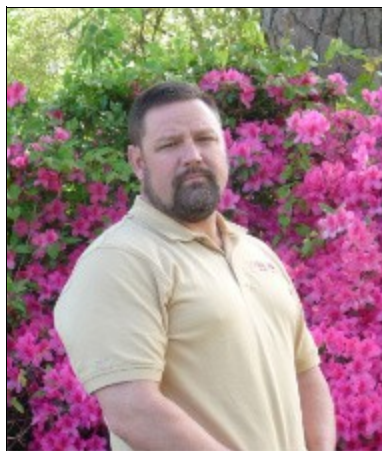
will be used in every way possible that you will hear more about soon!

First off, I would like to thank all of you who came out to St. Louis for the CKI Large Scale Service Project (LSSP)



because it was the largest showing that our district has had before with 8 attendees! I know that someone will be sharing how it was from the attendees' point of view so I just wanted to give you all some quick details about what went down in the Gateway City. With 140 CKI members in attendance

performing 27 hours of service each, LSSP was a success, contributing 3780 hours of community service to St. Louis. Members also participated in helping each of the CKI Service Partners which included raising \$135 for STUFH and \$551 for UNICEF: Six Cents! The projects were all over St. Louis and with these following organizations: SSM Cardinal Glennon Children's Medical Center, Nayberry Community Garden, Friends of Hamilton Village Community Garden, Block Unit 1035, Garden of Eaten Community Garden, Block Unit 429, 22nd Ward Community Garden, William Clay Community Garden, Syracuse Community Garden, Mathews-Dickey Boys & Girls Club, Herbert Hoover Boys & Girls Club, Jefferson National Expansion Memorial (St. Louis Arch), Habitat for Humanity build site, and the Habitat for Humanity ReStore. The LSSP committee did a fantastic job putting it all together and leading the groups. There was so much done and I cannot thank you all enough for coming out. I hope that more will be able to come out to LSSP next year!
